

BEACON HILL CIVIC ASSOCIATION

2025-2026 IMPACT

For our neighborhood, we:

- addressed 140 constituent concerns by phone or email.
- sent 124 informative newsletters to members and neighbors.
- planned and executed 39 events for greater community engagement.
- reviewed 82 architectural applications and 10 zoning and licensing matters.
- responded to and monitored 502 contractor parking permit requests.
- worked with the Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Services and the Zero Waste Department to install 2 food waste bins on Cambridge Street. These bins have collected over 7 tons of food waste since they were installed in June 2025.
- represented Beacon Hill at monthly Boston Police Department advisory meetings.
- organized and oversaw the care of the Beacon Hill Elms.
- worked with the Department of Public Works and Councilor Durkan to repave West Cedar, Revere, and Joy Streets.
- worked with the Department of Public Works to replace missing bricks on Charles Street.
- monitored the work of gas, electric and water utilities and kept the neighborhood apprised of their work schedules.
- remained involved in the planning of affordable owned units of housing at 27-29 Hancock Street.

In our wider neighborhood, we:

- worked with the Mayor's Office of Housing, our West End neighbors, and the chosen developers for the redevelopment of the West End Library, which will have 119 affordable units and a new, two-story public library. We continue to advocate for a project that reflects neighbors' concerns and priorities.
- continued to work with neighbors, stakeholders, law enforcement, and health and social services to address congregant drug use and homeless encampments under the Fanny Appleton and Longfellow bridges and to find solutions to that problem.
- worked with the Parks Department to monitor the number and impact of road races and loud public events on the Common.
- monitored MGH expansion construction in monthly project meetings and let neighbors know of their construction plans.
- continued to monitor plans for the redevelopment of the Hurley-Lindemann state complex.
